I teaspoon baking powder



Editorial

This region still has a vibrant bread-baking industry and, in addition, has succeeded in preserving its own unique culinary tradition of buckwheat crêpes.

Last month's feature on the life of a peasant struck a chord with many people, and it seems that quite a large proportion of readers do, in fact, combine growing their own vegetables, cutting their own wood, etc., with some other sort of business activity. This month we have features on several such imaginative businesses including Lin and Barry Bowden's sheep farm, Phil Steven's jewellery business, and Allan Kirton of Phoenix Workshop in Mael Carhaix.

February and March are sometimes quite difficult months for people in Central Brittany the cold Winter weather seems to drag on with no apparent hope of a new Spring - if anything, things are worse than usual this year, with many local people being quite despondant about the forthcoming presidential elections. There seems to be a general feeling that none of the canditates have grasped the nature of the problems facing this region, and that none of them are putting forward any realistic solutions. As editor of the Journal, I can report that this pessimistic mood is not shared by people moving to the region from outside. The Journal now has subscribers on four continents, and each month we have difficulty finding space for all the new businesses that want to set up here - which must be signs that economic recovery is on the way

In theory, a smoking ban is supposed to come into force in France on February 1th, with smoking being banned in all public places. The drinks industry has, however, won a concession from the government, and it has been decided that bars can provide sealed booths for customers who wish to smoke on the premises. In order to give bar owners time to install these booths, smoking will continue to be allowed until the end of the year....

Hunting Issues

Several readers have contacted the Journal with concerns about the various types of authorised and unauthorised hunting that takes place over the winter The numbers of hares and rabbits in Cotes d'Armor

have declined dramatically over recent years. Hunting organisations have tabled a plan to reintroduce rabbits to the Argoat region, blaming disease and habitat destruction for their disappearance; groups opposed to hunting believe that hunting is at least partly to blame. There is also concern about the continued hunting of birds in France. The 'Ligue pour la Préservation de la Faune Sauvage et la Défense des Non-Chasseurs' - Ligue ROC - says that 65 different species of birds are hunted in France which is more than in many other European countries. The Ligue is particularly concerned about the safety of the thrush which is a protected species in Northern Europe but still hunted in France.

The most effective way to help protect the local animals is to create a wild life refuge on your property.

Treatment for Skin Cancer in Pets

I would like to warn readers of the increase in skin cancer on cats and dogs with pink noses and ears, and also eye lids. It makes up 15% of cancers in cats and 5% in dogs and is most commonly associated with exposure to UV light and is most common on hairless, non-pigmented

skin.

I took my cat to the vet the first week in September as I was worried about a small sore on her nose, thinking it could be a bee sting. I was told to do nothing and it would heal; I made four more trips to the vet as I could see it was spreading; antibiotics and cortisone were prescribed. At the beginning of December, I asked to see another vet and for a biopsy to be done. The result was cancer; I then needed to know where I could take my cat, but they had no real idea. I contacted Cambridge University Veterinary Hospital; they were so helpful and recommended the Paris Ecole Veterinaire Centre de Cancerologie. They said that Dr Devauchelle was the top specialist in the field.

Harriet had a five hour journey by train and taxi, she spent ten days there having radiotherapy. Dr Devauchelle said that vets were making his job impossible: if he can treat the animal at the first sign of a small sore, they have a good chance of success.

I am asking all vets to be aware: show as much care for our small animals as you do to horses and cows. English people love their pets like one of their family. I feel Harriet has been so let down. Vets bills are very expensive, and we need them to have the passion to keep up with all the new treatment that is available when we desperately need their help.

I have found the office to be very helpful but am not sure if they have an English speaker there. I think if a lesson is to be learned it is that it is important for people settling here to make sure they understand what is being said to them with an agency that has someone who speaks English. Either that or have documents translated. We cannot assume that things are going to be the same as in England and even there I would be wondering why I had never received a policy. I wonder if they were in fact taking the premiums from the bank. Presumably not. It is a shame to find this out the hard way.

We have still had no reply from Groupama on this point. Ed.

Internet Provision

Just after New Year, we changed our Internet Service Provider and telephone provider to a company called Free.fr. From the minute we signed up to them, they took our telephone number and line from France Telecom, therefore cutting us off completely, phone and internet wise, for eight days. We got our internet line back after five days but it took them a further three days to connect our telephone. All this was without any word of warning, either by phone, email or anything. Meanwhile we had to go out and buy a mobile phone so we could contact our aged parents back in England to let them know we weren't dead, or whatever. Since we've had what they call their full service, we find that when we make telephone calls, more often than not, we get a dreadful echo on our side which makes it very difficult to concentrate on a conversation, and the internet connection drops incredibly often. For example, this morning I had to reboot the computer completely three times within 40 minutes while

working on the internet.

Breton Bread

Breton agriculture from the farming that takes place in other parts of France, is the tradition of growing a significant amount of buckwheat; this in turn has led to Bretons developing a cuisine that uses buckwheat as one of its staple grains. The buckwheat crêpe (or galette) is a variation of a culinary tradition, that is common to many

ne of the factors that distinguishes Celtic areas, of cooking breads on a griddle on an open fire.

> There are many variations in the preparation and cooking of the crêpe; a little wheat flour was often mixed with the buckwheat flour, so that the batter could be spread evenly on the griddle to give a thin crêpe that could be turned easily. Sometimes a thicker crêpe was carefully slit in half and filled with a layer of

No one really knows why Bretons should have opted to grow so much buckwheat. There is evidence to suggest that the grain was grown here in pre-Roman times, but its use almost certainly died out during the Roman occupation. Buckwheat starts being mentioned

again around the time of the Crusades, this, together with its local name 'Blé du Sarrasin', suggests that it was reintroduced to the area by people who had travelled to the Middle East.

Buckwheat fits well into a crop rotation system, because it is quite a different plant from other grains - such as wheat, rye, oats, barley - which are members of the grass family. Its use during the Middle Ages is believed to have been favoured by the fact that it was not included in the feudal system of tithes, and its production was therefore effectively untaxed. There are reports of riots having taken place in Brittany when the authorities tried to change the tax system to include buckwheat.

Buckwheat does not lend itself to cooking with yeast and that is why one does not get buckwheat loaves. Brittany has never, however, been totally dependent on buckwheat, and there is an equally strong tradition of cereal growing and the baking of

bread in the area.

Up until recently, Central Brittany was essentially rural and there were very few large towns, and, consequently, very few professional bakers Instead, people baked their own bread in communal bread ovens that were situated within walking distance of their homes.

Tradition has it that these ovens were fired once a fortnight, and that on baking day each family baked enough bread to last them for two weeks. There are many examples of these communal bread ovens to be seen all over the countryside, and they demonstrate a wide variation in size and quality of construction. Some are small, evidently made of stones gathered from the surrounding area, and usually set into a bank. Others are free-standing structures made of specially-cut granite stones, and obviously capable of cooking large quantities of bread.

In every case, the principle of operation is the same: the oven was filled with faggots which were set alight, with the fire being vented by the open door at the front of the oven; the fire would be kept going throughout the day (or perhaps during the night prior to baking day) until the stones had absorbed enough heat to cook one or two batches of bread. People from round about would then arrive with their dough in baskets; it was traditional for people to cook large loaves, about two foot across, possibly to avoid confusion about which loaf belonged to whom. The loaves were placed in

Flour Types: After the grain has been milled, the flour is passed through a sieve to remove a proportion of the bran and wheat germ. Different sized sieves are used to produce different types of flour. The ash content (after burning) is used to verify the type of flour e.g. T65 flour has 6.5% ash after burning.

A light flour, equivalent to strong white flour in the UK. T65

the oven, carefully watched, and pulled out when cooked.

Most people would have made their bread from wheat and tye flour that they grew themselves and which was ground at a local mill. In photographs of country life in Brittany dating back to the beginning of the twentieth century, one often sees the large loaves produced on these fortnightly baking days propped up against the wall.

Over recent years, fewer people have grown their own grain, and more people now have ovens in their own homes; the use of the communal bread oven has now, therefore, almost completely disappeared, and with it the social gathering that used to take place on bread-baking day.


However, the taste for good bread has survived and most towns and villages in the region still boast at least one bakery that bakes bread on the premises from fresh ingredients, and most markets in the region now have a stall selling wholemeal breads baked from locally-grown, organic grains.



Gérard and Frédérique Munier first started baking bread in Central Brittany over twenty-eight years ago, in Glomel. They relocated the business to Ker-

grist-Moëlou fourteen years ago when Gérard designed and built his own wood-fired oven beside their home.

The oven was upgraded six years ago due to the amount of work required in firing up and cleaning out a traditional oven.

La Baleine is a rare example of a modern boulangerie set in the heart of

the countryside. Customers are welcome to buy bread from the shop attached to the bakery, on Carhaix or Callac markets, or from health food shops in the area, such as Equilibre

in Carhaix.

Bread Recipes: Pain Bouillie

This traditional French bread uses rye flour, and the 'porridge' made by mixing flour, honey and water is left overnight to ferment. This recipe makes 2 loaves.

For the 'porridge': 8 oz (225 g) rye flour % pint (450 ml) boiling water 1 teaspoon clear honey



For the dough:

4 oz fresh yeast, or half a packet rapid action yeast

2 tablespoons lukewarm water

- 1 teaspoon caraway seeds, crushed (optional)
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 12 oz (350 g) bread flour
- olive oil
 - Sift the rye flour into a large bowl. Pour the boiling water over it and leave to stand for 5 min. Stir in the honey. Cover with a cloth and leave in a warm place for about 12 hours.
 - 2. Make a dough. Place the yeast in a bowl and stir in the water. Pour the yeast mixture into the 'porridge' and stir in with the crushed caraway seeds and salt. Add the wheat flour gradually, mixing first with a wooden spoon and then with your hands, until the mixture forms a firm dough.
 - Knead on a floured surface for 6-8 minutes, until smooth and elastic. Return to the bowl. Cover with a cloth, and leave to rise in a wooden place for 1½ hours, or until doubled in bulk.
 - 4. Punch down the dough, and divide into two equal pieces. Roll each piece into a 15 x 4½ inch (38 x 12 cm) rectangle. Fold the bottom third up, and the top third down, and press the edges together. Turn over.
 - Brush one side of the loaves with olive oil and place side by side in greased 1lb loaf tins. Cover with a cloth and leave to rise in a warm place for 1 hour.
 - 6. Brush the tops of the loaves with olive oil and, using a sharp knife, mark with one or two cuts. Bake for 30 min at 220°C (Gas Mark 7), then reduce the oven temperature to 190°C (Gas Mark 5) and bake for a further 20-25 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.

This classic Jewish bread is poached in boiling water. For variety, try topping with sesame seeds, crushed garlic or linseed. Makes 12 bagels.

1 lb 4 oz (600 g) strong plain white flour

1 packet fast-action dried yeast

2 teaspoons brown sugar

1 tablespoon salt

½ pint (275 ml) warm water

Poppy seeds

Method

- 1. Sift the flour into a medium-sized bowl and add the yeast, sugar and salt.
- 2. Pour in the warm water and combine to make a soft dough.
- Knead for 7 minutes then cover with a tea towel, and leave to rise in a warm place for 40 minutes
- Turn the dough out onto a floured surface and form into a long roll. Using a sharp knife, cut it up into twelve equal pieces. (Diagram 1)
- Shape each piece into a circle. Insert your thumb into the centre of each one to create a hole (diagram 2) and place them on a floured tray. Set them aside, and leave them uncovered for another 30 minutes.
- Fill a large pan two-thirds full of water and bring to the boil.
- Preheat the oven to 220°C (425°F) Gas Mark 7,
- 8. Drop three bagels into the water and boil for 2 minutes. Turn them over and boil for another minute. The bagels should firm and puff up.

- Using a slotted spoon, remove bagels from the water and drain for a minute on a wire rack with kitchen paper underneath. Sprinkle poppy seeds over both sides of the bagels.
- 10. Repeat the process with the remaining bagels, then place them on a greased baking tray and cook for 15 - 20 minutes. When the bagels are light brown on top, remove from the oven and transfer to a wire rack to cool.



Bread Recipes: Red Lentil Dosas

Dosas are naturally gluten-free pancakes eaten in Southern India. They are made with soaked lentils and rice, so begin a couple of days in advance!

Ingredients.

10 oz (300 g) long grain white rice 4 oz (125 g) red lentils 16 fl oz (500 ml) warm water 1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon turmeric freshly ground black pepper

2 tablespoons chopped fresh coriande oil for frying

Method:

- 1. Place the rice and lentils in a bowl and cover with the water. Leave to soak for 8 hours.
- Drain off any excess water and put aside to use later. Blend the soaked rice and lentils in a food processor until smooth. Add the reserved water and blend again.
- Put the mixture into a bowl, cover with a tea towel and leave in a warm place for 24 hours. During this time it should swell and harden and turn pink.
- Stir in the salt, turmeric, pepper and coriander.
- Heat a heavy-based frying pan over a medium heat for a few minutes until hot. Smear with oil and when it starts to smoke, add a small ladleful of batter. Using the rounded bottom of the ladle, gently spread out the batter into a circle.
- 6. Cook for a couple of minutes, until dry on top. Drizzle a little oil over the edge of the dosa, then turn over. Cook for another couple of minutes, until golden. Keep warm in a low oven while cooking the remaining dosas and serve warm.

Last month we published an example website glossary, this month we were going to tackle Firefox extensions but this has been rescheduled to appear next month as to understand Firefox and its extensions, you should first have a grounding on Open-Source Software.

Q – What is Firefox?

A – Firefox is a web browser from the Mozilla foundation (www.mozilla.com). It is a free alternative to what you have currently included with your operating system; e.g. with Windows its Internet Explorer. Firefox will work on Windows, Macs or Linux-based computers and is part of the Open-Source community.

Q - What is Open-Source?

- Open-Source is part of the Open-Source Initiative A – Open-Source is part of the Open-Source Initiative (OSI – www.opensource.org), which means that programmers are able to read, modify and distribute the source code of a particular piece of software. This means that over time, you potentially could have thousands of people work on just one program. For software to qualify as Open-Source it must have an accompanying OSI Certification – also, being Open-Source means it is completely free. It you find software that is purported to be fully Open-Source and free, make sure it is has OSI Certification with it

Q - Isn't free software time-limited?

A - Time-limited software is Shareware, a sort of try before you buy concept, which is something completely different.

Q - What sort of Open-Source software applications are available?

A - There are countless applications out there - at

least one equivalent for just about every kind of software that you have to buy. For example, why pay hundreds of euros for Microsoft Office when there is a virtual equivalent in OpenOffice (www.openoffice.org)

completely free, you just download and use it if you are worried about compatibility, OpenOffice allows you to save in native Word or Excel formats, which means those documents can be opened and edited in Microsoft Office.

Q – But isn't quality and reliability compromised because so many different people work on a particular program?
A – To quote the OSI themselves: "Open source promotes software reliability and quality by supporting independent peer review and rapid evolution of source core."

Q - But what about security?

Q – But what about security?

A – Open-Source applications are generally much more secure than their closed-source counterparts. Solutions are found and implemented quicker because they are not subject to company policy and not folly to a false sense of security. OSI cite the famous to a raise sense of security. OSI cite the famous "Ping o' Death" exploit as a good example; When this was discovered, Linux (an Open-Source operating system) had patches available within hours; closed-source operating systems took months to provide the same solutions.

Q - And what about reliable support?

A - Not only are mature Open-Source programs far more reliable to begin with, the support, if needed is dramatically cheaper and easier to get than from paid-for software manufacturers. There are no 5 Euro-per-minute helplines to call, just a huge, friendly user-base to pose your questions at. You can find help usually in forums that are dedicated to helping others.

At the very end

February in the Garden

Parsnips: Sow parsnip seeds towards the end of the month. Ideally they should be sown in weed-free, stone-free, reasonably well-draining soil. Either sow the seeds thinly in rows one foot apart or in 'stations' of three or four seeds nine inches apart, and thin them once they start to grow

Parsnips are a valuable crop in Brittany because ever though they grow well here and make an excellent Win-ter vegetable they are difficult to find in the shops. Seeds sown in February usually produce the best plants because they have time to reach a reasonable size before the onset of dry weather in the Summer

Peas: Peas can be sown at regular intervals from February to the beginning of Summer. At this time of year, it is the smooth-skinned varieties that should be sown. Peas benefit from fertile soil: to maximise your crop, dig a trench about one foot deep, fill it with compost, and cover it over with a few inches of soil. If your garden is troubled by mice and birds it is worthwhile to protect each pea seed with a ring of plastic, cut from a water bottle

The reason why vegetable gardeners persist in growing peas even when frozen peas are so cheap to buy is because it is impossible to buy peas that come anywhere close to matching the taste of peas picked from your own garden. Experts will confirm that the taste deteriorates significantly even over the first hour after picking.

Litter in the Breton Countryside

The Problem

Up until about fifty years ago, people living in the Breton countryside bought hardly anything from shops, and therefore produced very little litter: everything produced on their farms was completely biodegradable, things that they bought were usually made from iron, leather, wood, or cloth, and there was little or no packaging. It was therefore the habit to dump unwanted goods in a secluded corner of the farmyard, confident in the knowledge that, over the course of time, it would dis-

When shops started to appear in the region, and people were encouraged to start buying things that had been produced in factories, and commercial plants, no one explained to them that they would be taking things into the countryside that were essentially not part of the natural world, or at least not part of the natural world as it appertains to Central Brittany.

Consequently people continued in the age old practice of throwing unwanted items onto rubbish heaps at the bottom of their gardens, and these rubbish heaps now represent a serious problem. Almost wherever you go in the countryside, you are likely to come across piles of yoghurt pots, beer and wine bottles, plastic milk bottles, plastic carrier bags, and other sundry items of supermarket packaging. To make matters worse, the remnants of products that have been sold to farmers over the years are often mixed up in these piles: bits of black plastic sheeting, electric wire, syringes, fertiliser bags, and pill bottles. Brambles, ivy, and nettles are often growing amongst the litter.

The Solution

February is a good time to tackle this problem because most of the vegetation has died down: get a good pair of gloves, wrap up warm, and on a sunny day go round the village with a wheelbarrow, piling in all the bits and pieces of rubbish from the hedgerows and from beside the footpaths. It is a job that may have to be repeated each year as more rubbish is exposed on the surface, but each time that you do it, the countryside round where you live will look more attractive. Even though we may not be conscious of the litter around us, it is always a surprise to discover how much better things looks when it has been removed.

his festival is equivalent to Pancake Day in the $oldsymbol{1}$ UK, and its origins go back to pagan times. The round pancake is said to represent the sun, which will soon return bringing an end to Winter. Wheat flour is used in abundance because the new crop will soon be planted.

Traditionally, the first pancake is tossed up onto the top of the cupboard, where it is left, in the belief that this will protect the crop from mildew. Also, if the frying pan is held in the right hand, and a coin held in the left hand, it is said to ensure prosperity for the rest of the year.

Girls who wanted to marry were told that if they could toss a pancake six times in a row without letting it fall to the ground, they would find their future husband within the year.

The name 'Chandeleur' comes from a Roman holiday called 'Festa Candelarum', or 'Festival of Candles', and in the Middle Ages torchlit processions passed through the streets on the 2nd February.



The Yews at Kergrist-Moëlou


Breton: Gwez kenaoù garzh "hedge nuts tree" (Gwez = trees; kenaoù = nuts; garzh = hedge)

Catkins in Spring; shade and shelter in Summer; nuts in Autumn; wood in Winter. This is the hazel - a true native of Brittany which can be found growing everywhere, but especially on banks bordering fields where it has been planted for its wood. Most of the hazel trees in this area were coppiced at one time or another, but have now been allowed to grow out; yet it is believed that when cut down on a regular four or five year basis, hazel trees live longer than when not cut at all. December to February is the best time for cutting hazel, and the trunks should be cut as low to the ground as possible - when Spring arrives buds will form and fresh young trunks sprout forth.

Hazel rods have for a long time been prized for their use in country crafts, and faggots made from cooking and heating bread ovens in times past.
